THE EPOCH OF INCREDULITY

Wintertime is a great season to dive into one of the many holiday works of Charles Dickens. From the classic *A Christmas Carol* to the lesser-known yuletide novellas *The Haunted Man*, *The Cricket on the Hearth*, or *The Chimes*, many of Dickens' works are synonymous with the Christmas holiday that he, in good measure, helped to define through his literary oeuvre.

But this Christmas, I decided to cozy-up to the fire with a reading of a Dickens masterpiece that has nothing really to do with the holiday, *A Tale of Two Cities*.

The novel, set in French Revolutionary times, symbolically casts the staid tranquility of London against the turbulent times across the Channel in Paris as a dichotomy for the ups and downs of the human condition through the use of extreme examples of good and evil; happiness and despair; sin and salvation.

It's a real page turner if you're into sprawling Victorian epics.

Yet, I didn't get past the first sentence of the book before I found myself musing about the eerie prescience of Dickens' description of the tumultuous period in which the novel is set as it applies to our current, somewhat dystopian times.

Most everybody is familiar with the famous opening line of *A Tale of Two Cities*: "It was the best of times, it was the worst of times..."

If nothing else, you've at least tapped your toes to the Dickensian inspired classic rock hit *The Best of Times* by Styx.

But as the book's opening continued with, "...it was the age of wisdom, it was the age of

foolishness, it was the epoch of belief, it was the epoch of incredulity..." I was struck by the term "epoch of incredulity."

It felt like an apt description of our modern, incredulous times.

The last several years have been frequently defined by the gaslighting piety of the "woke mob" lecturing us all that seeing things for what they are is an unenlightened, shameful worldview. And don't dare say what you're thinking and actually describe things for the way they are or you risk castigation as a toxically masculine, xenophobic, racist misanthrope.

No, we live in a time – in an epoch – where the degree of offensiveness of your speech is judged by the willingness of someone, anyone, to feign self-righteous indignation over the dog whistle that they claim to hear in the presumably sinister space between your words. They don't even have to be the object of your words, they simply need be the abject casualty of their perceived intolerance toward a yet-to-be-named, hypothetical victim.

From media slant to protestor chant; from Hollywood's chiding to political gaslighting, we've all seen how the "snowflake" blizzard has done a snow job on the objective truth... how our modern predicament redefines candor as slander in a confusing and confounding,

topsy-turvy world gone mad.

I, myself, tend toward credulity when confronted with the things before my very eyes. I do so to the dismay of the haters who don't like it when people disrupt their false narrative, as I've done so many times through my advocacy for police specifically and the truth generally.

I'll continue to do so – as have a handful of others who've rebuffed politically correct fallacies – because, as Dickens writes later in his *Tale*, "It is a far, far better thing that I do than I have ever done."

The thing I like about Dickens' works is the certain optimism that underlies them. Almost all of his writings conclude with a happy – or at the very least, just – ending.

We find optimism even in his pessimism because, the epoch of incredulity can at once be the epoch of belief.

The worst of times can also be, the best of times.

Here's wishing you the best of times as we chime in a New Year and hopefully, put the epoch of incredulity behind us.

CONTRACT CORNER

LABOR DISPUTE WITH CITY ESCALATES AS LAWSUITS AND LEGISLATION ARE FILED

BAD FAITH BARGAINING SUIT HEADS TO COURT

Diplomacy can only have two possible outcomes: war or peace.

Despite our best efforts toward a diplomatic solution, the cop-hating defunder, Mayor Tishaura Jones, and her inept lackey, Chief John Hayden, are only interested in war.

So it is war they shall have.

As I'm sure you all know, the City stomped away from union contract talks on April 2, 2021, withdrawing its so-called "last, best offer" and declaring an impasse along with the termination of the collective bargaining agreements for Police Officers and Sergeants all at once.

The problem?

Under both Missouri law and the controlling contractual language, the City and the Police Department are required to act in good faith at the bargaining table – which, by their own admissions, they failed to do – otherwise it is unlawful and a breach of contract to breakoff contract talks or repudiate existing labor agreements. It is likewise unlawful to withdraw a final offer, particularly without notice, but what do you expect from the anti-employee, union-busters Hayden sent to the table: Mike Sack, JD McCloskey, and Will Brown.

So, left with no alternative but litigation, our Union filed suit on December 7 seeking an injunction against the City and declaratory judgement finding that the City acted in bad faith and ordering it to return to the table and honor the existing CBA's until new agreements are ratified or until a good-faith impasse is reached. But, that's not the only litigation afoot. The City has filed suit in Cole County attempting to overturn the "Law Enforcement Officers Bill of Rights" that we

were instrumental in passing through the Legislature last year. The law does nothing more than place due process protections in the statutes for all cops in Missouri. We already had many of those same protections in our CBA's but, we could see that Hayden and the City wanted to try to strip those rights away in bargaining so we advocated successfully for those rights to be memorialized in law. Now Tishaura and company are trying to use the courts in a far away county to overturn the bill of rights and to deprive every cop in Missouri of fair treatment and due process.

This is what happens when you have a tyrannical, out-of-control administration in a city like St. Louis.

The lawsuits fly.

I'm certain we all expect the two internal candidates for police chief to sue for discrimination and win easily because of Mayor Jones's very public comments that their race and gender disqualified them from consideration for the job. Likewise, Jones's conduct in forcing the Director or Personnel out the door and passing over his deputy directors for the job of acting director is certain to result in lawsuits, as is the Mayor's attempt to change the Civil Service rules to turn the independent-by-design Department of Personnel into a hyper-politicized

patronage office. Our Union is talking with other labor organizations who represent city employees about suing over that unlawful activity too.

We had also given some consideration to suing to return control of the City Police Department to the State of Missouri. Under Prop A, the ballot initiative that allows St. Louis to operate its own police force, the City is required to do certain things otherwise, control of the police force defaults to the State. Among those required responsibilities are: (1) honoring all contracts; (2) refraining from political interference with the police department; (3) maintaining a distinct disciplinary process for the "unique" operation of a police department; and, (4) providing necessary police funding.

The City hasn't done any of those things under this administration.

But rather than go through an expensive, drawn-out litigation over the return of the City police force to State control, we decided it would be much quicker and far less expensive to just ask the Legislature to pass a law taking control of SLMPD back.

And thanks to some great friends in the General Assembly, that's exactly what's happened. The same lawmakers who filed the Law Enforcement Officers Bill of Rights last year have filed State Control bills this year; Representative Nick Schroer in the lower chamber and Senator Bill Eigel in the upper chamber.

Contrary to unsubstantiated rumors, the bills DO NOT affect your pension in any way. Sen. Eigel's introduced bill and Rep. Schroer's committee substitute preserve the existing pension language and include zero changes to the pension. 

Jeff Roorda launches Senate bid






