

Editorial...

Beware Of Pirates

I don't usually write a lot of editorial content for the Gendarme but, I wanted to set the record straight on something.

I've heard people talking a lot about a new FaceBook page that went up recently called "Pirates Pension." This page went up right about the same time Gary Wiegert was removed from his seat as a trustee by the other members of the PRS pension board. The page is pretty obviously meant to defend Wiegert and to damage the reputation of the pension trustees who voted unanimously to remove him from the board for misconduct in office.

But, one attack post on the page had some of our members asking questions of me and other S.L.P.O.A. board

members. The post, which is included with this editorial, claims "Brian Millikan was the successful attorney who won the disability lawsuit for Sgt. Mike Pratt. Millikan did the work pro bono to assist a fellow working policeman in his time of need. Previously the St. Louis Police Association by laws would provide and pay for attorneys at pension disability hearings, but since Jeff Roorda was hired that service is no longer provided to members. Since SLPOA money is squandered on Business Manager Jeff Roorda's salary, medical and 401k, that benefit is no long provided to injured officers, who seek attorney assistance in front of the Pirates of the Pension Board."

Members had legit concerns after reading this but, as I've already assured many of them, the pirates post is packed with lies and I wanted to

share the facts with our entire membership. While it's true that Brian Millikan represented Sgt. Pratt in his disability case, he didn't do it pro bono as the Wiegert friendly page claims. Brian was paid by the S.L.P.O.A. to represent Sgt. Pratt. Brian is a great attorney who cares a lot about our members and provides legal services to our members through the association for about half his normal hourly rate. He'd do just about anything for our members but it's untrue that he didn't get paid for the excellent services he provided Sgt. Pratt that resulted in his disability

pension being approved.

It's also absolutely untrue that our bylaws provide for legal representation for disability hearings. That coverage is not a guaranteed benefit and has always been on a case by case basis. We've generally only paid for disability lawyers when a positive outcome in the case would benefit all of our members by setting a precedent that helped everybody.


The Wiegert pirate page also claims that the S.L.P.O.A. "squanders" member dues on our business manager Jeff Roorda's "salary, medical, and 401K" benefits. First of all, Jeff doesn't get medical insurance or a 401K. And his salary is well below the norm for a union business manager. In a survey of business managers on the St. Louis Labor Council a few years ago, Jeff

was the lowest paid B.M. in St. Louis, even though just about any B.M. would tell you that Jeff has the toughest job of any of them. Jeff is the only B.M. surveyed in St. Louis who makes less than six-figures and leaders of other unions all have very lucrative pension and healthcare packages. Like the other four S.L.P.O.A. office employees, Jeff gets a 3.25% employer contribution to an I.R.A., the smallest retirement contribution allowed by law. If you want something to compare that too, the City contributes about 33% of an average police officer's salary to your pension system. That's the system that Jeff has fought tooth and nail to protect for you guys.

Wiegert on the other hand put that system in jeopardy through his statements that

got him thrown off the pension board, just like he was thrown out of the S.L.P.O.A. a few years back. Wiegert also made very public statements that he would refuse to allow police officers who had to retire because of COVID-19 to even apply for disabilities. We had at least two officers nearly die from COVID-19 so it seems a little strange now that Wiegert or his supporters would put a post on their pirate page pretending like Wiegert is some sort of hero for disability applicants.

Brian Millikan is a hero for disability applicants. So is Jeff Roorda. These guys and our other lawyers, lobbyists and board members are the guys who are fighting for you everyday not just on pension and disabilities but on due process rights and union rights. Don't let Gary Wiegert call Jeff or anyone in the S.L.P.O.A a pirate. Wiegert's the one who had to walk the plank!

NO MORE “MISTER NICE GUY”

HAYDEN SHOULD BE REMEMBERED HONESTLY

On September 8, Chief John Hayden announced his plans to retire in February of next year.

That's welcomed news. Hayden has been an embarrassment and a failure.

I don't think there is much debate about that. You'd be hard-pressed to find anyone who would be praiseful of the abysmal job Hayden has done at the helm of the St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department.

But there does seem to be a disagreement about one thing: The quality of his character.

Let's settle that one once-and-for-all.

I have heard many people utter words like these during Hayden's tenure, “Yeah, he's a terrible chief but, at least Hayden's a nice guy.”

Untrue.

I understand the impulse to arrive at this conclusion. The “nice guy” label is the same assessment I had of Hayden in my early interactions with him.

He is able to come off as charming or even affable in his bumbling “aw shucks” sort of way.

But, I've come to recognize that as a façade. The affable part, not the bumbling part, that is.

At a time when we needed a police chief to support the difficult work his officers do in the nation's deadliest city and declare a war on violent crime, Hayden instead declared war on his own employees. And, when the Association stood-up and defended those officers and police

civilians, Hayden declared war on us too.

As violent crime spiraled out of control and the body count mounted while his complete lack of a crime plan took its terrible human toll, Hayden obsessively fixated on persecuting the very people who he should have been supporting: the police officers under his command.

In fact, he should not only have been supporting them. He should have been leading them.

He never did either.

I guess that should come as no surprise. Hayden spent the lion's share of his career in Internal Affairs under the tutelage of people like Reggie Harris. People like that have this perverse self-image of themselves as “crusaders for integrity” within the police department.

In Hayden's case, nothing could be further from the truth.

Integrity is making certain that a just outcome is reached.

Enduring a police chief who pursues petty distractions when he should be leading a police force in battle against epic street violence is not a just outcome for the people of St. Louis, particularly those who lost their lives to violence or the loved-ones who mourn them.

Being second-guessed for every decision you make as a police officer by the very same guy who leaves you to figure things out for yourself because of his refusal to lead, is not a just outcome.

Ignoring civil service regulations, due process requirements and your contractual obligations to the duly authorized union representative of the rank-and-file is not a just outcome.

Hayden surrounded himself with a very small inner circle of the worst human beings to ever work for this police department, like-minded despots bent on bringing their unruly subjects to their knees. Hayden created an organizational culture of cutthroat malevolence toward the front-line employees of the department; a sort of *Targaryen* delirium that

resulted in a steady chorus of “off with their heads” bellowing from the Mad King's throne.

And, as he smiled widely through the mistreatment of his subordinates, some mistook Hayden's Cheshire grin for good-naturedness. I rather believe – with all my heart – that Hayden smiled through his reign of terror because he very much enjoyed destroying the lives of the great police officers who suffered his wrath.

Is Hayden a nice guy?

Ask Roger Engelhardt. Ask Jatonya Clayborn-Muldrow. Ask Billy Olsten. Ask Joe Schmitt. Ask Kyle Bataoel. Ask Johnny Foote. Ask Adam Feaman. Ask Tommy Streckfuss. Ask Marty Zajac. Ask Tina Winterbauer. Ask Melanie Menendez. Ask Roger Murphey. Ask Gus Walker. Ask Steve Pinkerton. Ask Rob Jauer. Ask Brian Jost. Ask Emin Talic. Ask Danny O'Brien. Ask Zach Foltz.

Ask Rashard Lovelace.

And the list goes on and on and on.

Hayden deserves to be remembered for what he is: A terrible police chief who surrounded himself with terrible people who did terrible things.

They say that nothing cleans up your reputation like retiring. Once you're gone, people turn their attention to more immediate threats and tend to slowly forget how bad you were as time fades and they compare their foggy memory of you to the crisp reality of their current predicament.

The danger of this is, the perpetrators of bad deeds are only remembered in the most forgiving light. They are allowed to rest on their laurels and to have their legacy viewed through the blurry lens of hindsight. And that bonhomie emboldens the next generation of tyrants to act with impunity, unafraid of the awful fate of being remembered accurately for what you did. For who you were.

Here's the reality: John Hayden destroyed this police department and destroyed the lives of a lot of good people in the process.

Don't forgive.

Don't forget.

And, don't allow him the kindness of being remembered as something he wasn't.

No more “Mister Nice Guy.”







HATIN' HAYDEN SHOWS HIS DISDAIN FOR POLICE BY REFUSING TO HONOR LEAVE REQUIREMENT FOR IDA HUMANITARIAN MISSION

John Hayden hates cops.

If you haven't figured that out by now, you're not paying attention.

Hayden made a career in IAD collaring police officers, most of whom didn't deserve the discipline or unfair treatment they received. And when Hayden became chief, he weaponized IAD, FIU and the Body Worn Camera unit dubbing them his "trident," the name given to the three-pronged spear wielded by Poseidon.

In the devastating wake of Hurricane Ida, Hayden seized on the opportunity to remind us all one more time how much he dislikes police.

When the F5 tornado ripped through Joplin in 2011, Fraternal Order of Police lodges from around the country sent members to help. The SLPOA sent members too.

When the Oklahoma State FOP showed-up in Joplin with their disaster trailer, Missouri FOP leaders said, "we gotta get one of those."

In no time at all, we had our own operational



Missouri FOP disaster trailer that was quickly being deployed for floods, riots and tornados around our state and for natural disasters in nearby states when the call went out for help. Later, we also acquired an industrial strength mobile generator, affectionately known as "Big Blue."

The SLPOA also negotiated a provision in our Collective Bargaining Agreement shortly after Joplin, that allowed for up to two members at a time to be deployed for up to seven days when the Missouri FOP disaster trailer was deployed.

During almost any disaster, the local police are working double-shifts with no days off. Their families and homes suffer the same hardships and damage that everyone else in the stricken community is facing. These officers are often working in hazardous post-disaster conditions with no food, water or power. And, because of the long hours at work, they are unable to attend to their own families or repair their own homes.

That's where we come in.

After Louisiana was pummeled by Ida, the call went out for assistance to every FOP lodge in the country. We quickly answered, "help is on the way."

Right away, members Marcus Alston and Joe Busso volunteered for the dangerous deployment to the disaster zone in southern Louisiana. Over 400,000 homes and businesses were without power. We

loaded up our Lodge vehicle with bottled water, mosquito repellant, surgical masks and sanitary supplies.

And off they went.

Joe and Marcus joined up with the Missouri disaster trailer and other FOP disaster teams from around the country. They fed cops, repaired their roofs, cut down trees, and generally cared for the needs of families of the local officers working around the clock.

When Marcus and Joe came back, members Brian Eisele and Kevin Ahlbrand headed down in their place.

As soon as the deployment was announced we notified Chief Hayden and put-in for the paid leave time our designated members were entitled to.

And what did they Chief say?

"NO!"

We understand that their is a dispute over the status of our Collective Bargaining Agreement as a result of Hayden sabotaging the contract talks and the Chief and the City walking away from the bargaining table.

We believe, as do our lawyers, that the courts will find that the City broke the law and order them to honor the contract and return to the bargaining table.

But, even if our contract wasn't in force, federal law requires that an employer honor their "last, best offer" in contract talks. That offer included paid leave time for officers when the FOP disaster trailer is activated.

So, no matter how you slice it, Hayden is breaking the law and breaching his contractual duties.

We've filed a grievance.

We will win that grievance.

And, the officers who bravely responded to Ida will get their backpay.

Hayden knows that. Some people think he's just messing with our union. That it is the union he hates.

It's not.

It is the coppers who embarked on this mission of mercy who are out the paid time they had coming. The union didn't lose anything.

The thing Hayden doesn't like about the union is that we get in the way of his mistreatment of cops.

Make no mistake about it: It is you that Hatin' Hayden hates.

SLPOA Addresses Letter on Mandatory Vaccination Program

Members:

As a result of our efforts, the Department of Personnel issued a new memo outlining clarifications to the City's recently-adopted mandatory vaccination program. That memo was distributed department-wide by Lt. Col. Sack on September 8th and is also attached here.

The memo addressed three issues that our organization raised: deadline for submission of documents; rescheduling of testing appointments for good cause; and, clarification on the scope of the medical records release authorized by the "HIPAA form."

These concessions are a major victory for all of our members and we should celebrate that. We would have preferred that our members not be compelled to submit to vaccinations against their will but, the caselaw is simply not on our side.

We now have clarity though, thanks to this new memo, that missing a testing appointment will not result in automatic discipline as originally communicated by the City; that no medical records will be disclosed other than vaccination status/testing results which will be closely guarded; and that employees cannot be forced to submit required documents prior to the October 15th deadline.

We want to make sure to caution our members at the rank of sergeant and above that the Director of Personnel made it abundantly clear in his memo that supervisors and commanders are prohibited from demanding that these forms be submitted before the deadline. The Director has the authority to terminate you if you violate this directive so we strongly urge our supervisory members to not make any demands of their subordinates in violation of the DOP regulation as described in the memo.

We had hoped that the City would also heed our objection to the reference in the HIPAA forms to "voluntary" execution of the form. Executing the form is obviously not voluntary. If you refuse, you will almost certainly be terminated. If you have a strong objection to executing a form that incorrectly describes your signing as voluntary, we suggest you strikethrough the words "authorizing the disclosure of this health information is voluntary and that" and initial that strikethrough before you

sign the form.

We also want to make sure you understand that we will not provide legal representation to members who decide to decline both vaccination and weekly testing.

Weekly testing is a recognized accommodation under the law so it is our recommendation that you opt for the weekly testing if you object to the forced vaccination.

Finally, we had previously recommended that you delay signing the Declaration Form or the HIPAA Form until we advised otherwise. With these new clarifications/concessions, we are now recommending that members sign the forms by the October 15th deadline, exercising whichever option you prefer between testing or vaccination.

Please also be aware that we believe that the City violated its lawful duty to bargain over the implementation of this mandatory vaccination program and we will be including that allegation in the bad faith bargaining lawsuit our attorney's are currently preparing. It'll be up to a Judge to decide what remedies apply to the Union and our members for the City's violation of our due process rights on this topic.

We hope this answers any questions that you have but please feel free to talk to your Division Rep, our Union President Jay Schroeder or our Business Manager Jeff Roorda if you have any additional questions.

Have a safe & healthy Patriot Day as we remember our heroic brothers and sisters who were lost on this 20th anniversary of the 911 Attacks.

SUBJECT: Clarification to Administrative Regulation NO. 151 Employee COVID-19 Vaccination

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide three points of clarification in response to questions I have received from the unions regarding the policy on COVID-19 vaccination.

First, please be advised that although the Vaccination Declaration Form must be submitted by employees no later than October 15, 2021, it is not mandated that employees submit the form prior to this date. Furthermore, management does not have the authority to require employees to submit this form in advance. **Therefore, any efforts by management to force employees to submit the Vaccination Declaration Form before October 15, 2021 must cease and desist immediately.**

Second, if an employee fails to appear for their scheduled testing appointment and is not on approved leave, it is the responsibility and right of each appointing authority to determine whether or not it was for a legitimate reason. Each appointing authority has the discretion to allow their employees to reschedule a missed testing appointment if in their judgment there were reasonable mitigating circumstances resulting in failing to appear for a scheduled testing appointment.

Third, the HIPAA-compliant release authorizing the City to verify the vaccinations of its employees will only be used for the purposes of verifying vaccinations for the COVID-19 virus. No other medical histories will be reviewed and disseminated. Further, only authorized employees of the Department of Health will have access to this information. **No other City departments will receive these federally protected employee health records.** Additionally, the Department of Personnel will only receive a list of the names of employees from the Department of Health.


